Edwin Bryan Sartuche of Squaw Valley aka "Uncle Eddie, Tupishna" was born on January 21, 1928 in Visalia and started his journey to the other side on November 22, 2017 in Visalia, California.

Eddie was raised in Drum Valley by his mother and grandparents of the Wuksachi band. He drove trucks starting at the age of 16 until he retired many years later. Eddie's gift of teaching and giving lead him to sharing his language, traditions and cultures to anyone interested including four generations of his own family.

He also had a yearly gathering at 4 Season Lodge for 17 years where the theme of TOGETHER Yet-whin, TOGETHERNESS Yet-whin-shee was shared. He believed deeply in the ways of his people and felt great pride in the fact that his children and grandchildren would try to carry on these old ways.

Eddie aka Uncle Eddie, Tupishna is survived by his eight children:

Eddie Jr. and wife Christina, Yolanda her husband William Chambers, Richard and his wife Sandra, a daughter Valerie Martinez, a son Mark, Johnny and his wife Connie, a daughter Sandra and son Gary. In addition, he is survived by 21 grandchildren and numerous great and great-great grandchildren.

He was truly the patriarch of a large and loving family that included many nephew, nice and friends.
